Answers to Commonly Asked Questions:

What qualifications do I need to become a troop leader?

You should:

- enjoy working with girls.
- subscribe to the beliefs and values of Girl Scouting and register as a member.
- be at least 18 years old, display maturity and the ability to lead girls toward independent behavior.

What training available?

- an *Orientation to Girl Scouting and a Basic Leadership* course.
- additional training's such as transition training, outdoor training, first aid, and many others.

When and where do troops meet?

- Troops meet when and as often as is allowed by the girl's and leader's schedule – weekly, twice a month, or for special events only.
- After school, on weekends, or even during the supper hour (with a bag lunch).
- Troops meet in schools, churches or homes. Local Service Teams assist troops with meeting space requirements.



What support can I expect as a leader?

- Each town has a Service Team comprised of local volunteers who meet monthly to provide support, organize local programs, and provide information to leaders on upcoming events, trainings, and programs.
- Leaders are provided with materials like a troop notebook, *Safety-Wise*, *Leader's Digest*, registration forms, insurance and product sale materials.
- Local and council programs are offered to enhance troop activities.
- Girl Scouts of Rolling Hills Council maintains and operates Camp Agnes DeWitt for outdoor experiences.
- Leaders are encouraged to hold a yearly parent meeting to solicit co-leaders and troop committee parents such as troop treasurer, car-pool organizer, product sales parents, etc.

What are the benefits of leading a troop?

- The opportunity to work with girls and be a positive role model.
- A sense of contribution and accomplishment.
- The joy of sharing knowledge, experience, skills or talents.
- The opportunity for personal growth and development.
